## LEGISLATIVE PREVIEW

The MWRA Advisory Board will be presenting a preview of its 2013-2014 legislative package to the Executive Committee and Full Advisory Board next month. The package will be up for a vote in November. In addition, AB staff will be presenting its legislative priorities to the MWRA AB Caucus Chairman for input prior to statutory language being put together. These items include: Debt Service Assistance, legislation seeking \$100 million for Economic Development from the state that would further local development and job creation while helping new applicants enter the MWRA water system by paying for the connection costs; and Chemical Reimbursements, which was a line item funded from 1987-2009 that reimbursed chemical costs associated with wastewater facilities. The Advisory Board will be working with the AB Caucus Chair to file these bills and other important pro-ratepayer initiatives.
